PURPOSE:

Fun and safe environment for San José youth

Pro-social and enrichment activities

Decrease summer learning loss

Increased awareness of services

Application Highlights

- Total available funding \$500,000
- 86 applications requesting a total of \$643,042
- 49 contracts totaling \$431,770
- Remaining funds to supplement PRNS summer programming:
 - Camp scholarships
 - Hot Spot Sites

Services Provided

Total number of unduplicated participants served: 5,263

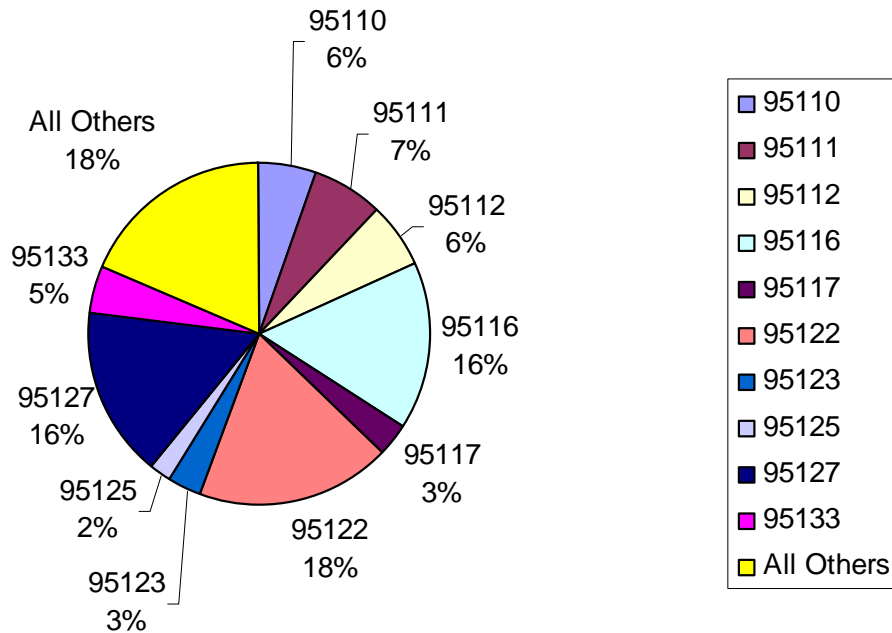
Educational and Creative Programs: including music, theatre, personal development, and academic enrichment

Sports Participation and Instruction: including basketball, baseball, football, dance, and other teambuilding activities

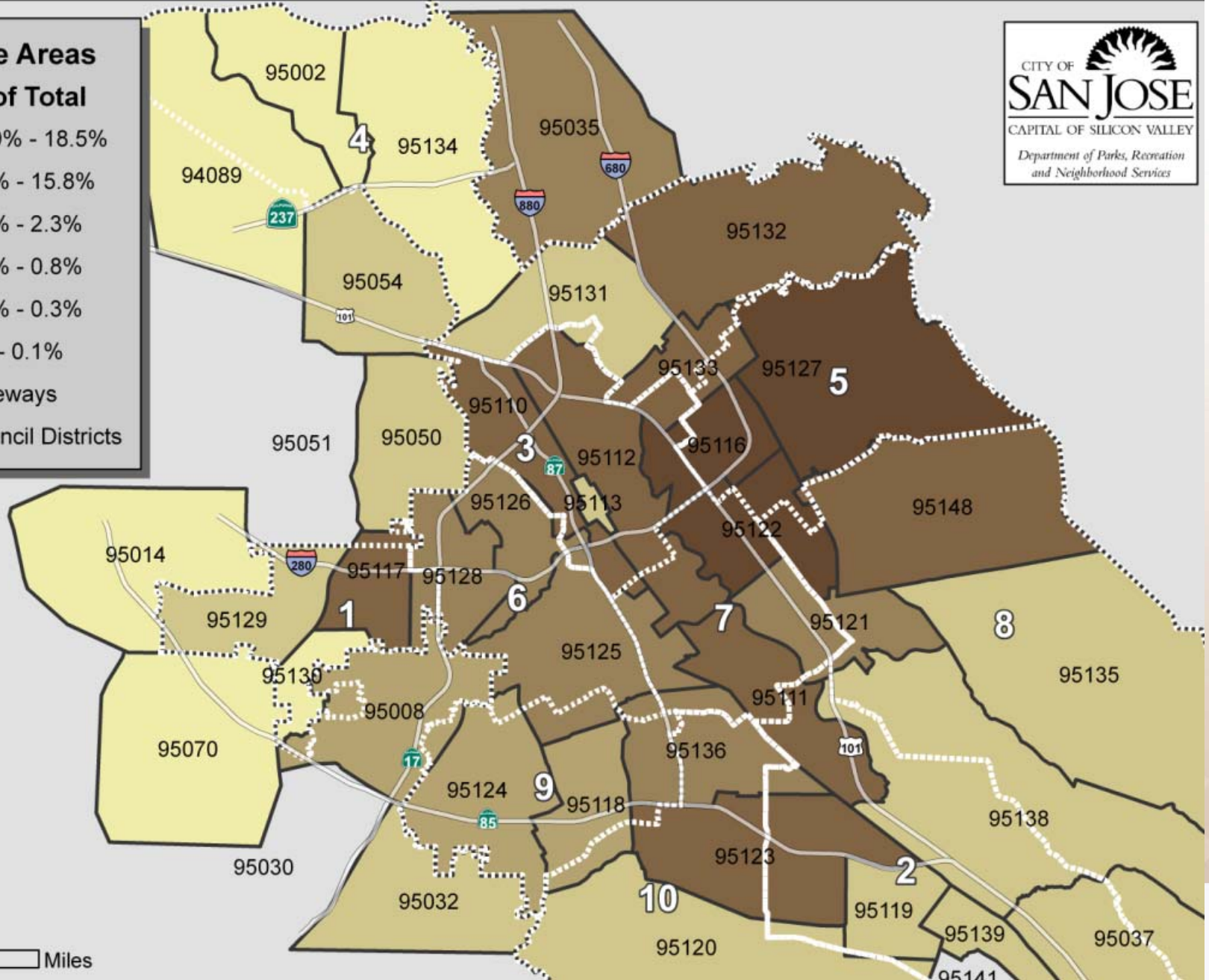
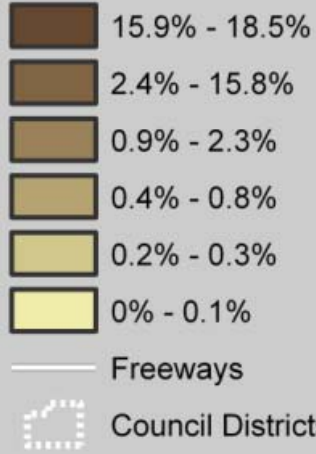

Percent of Total



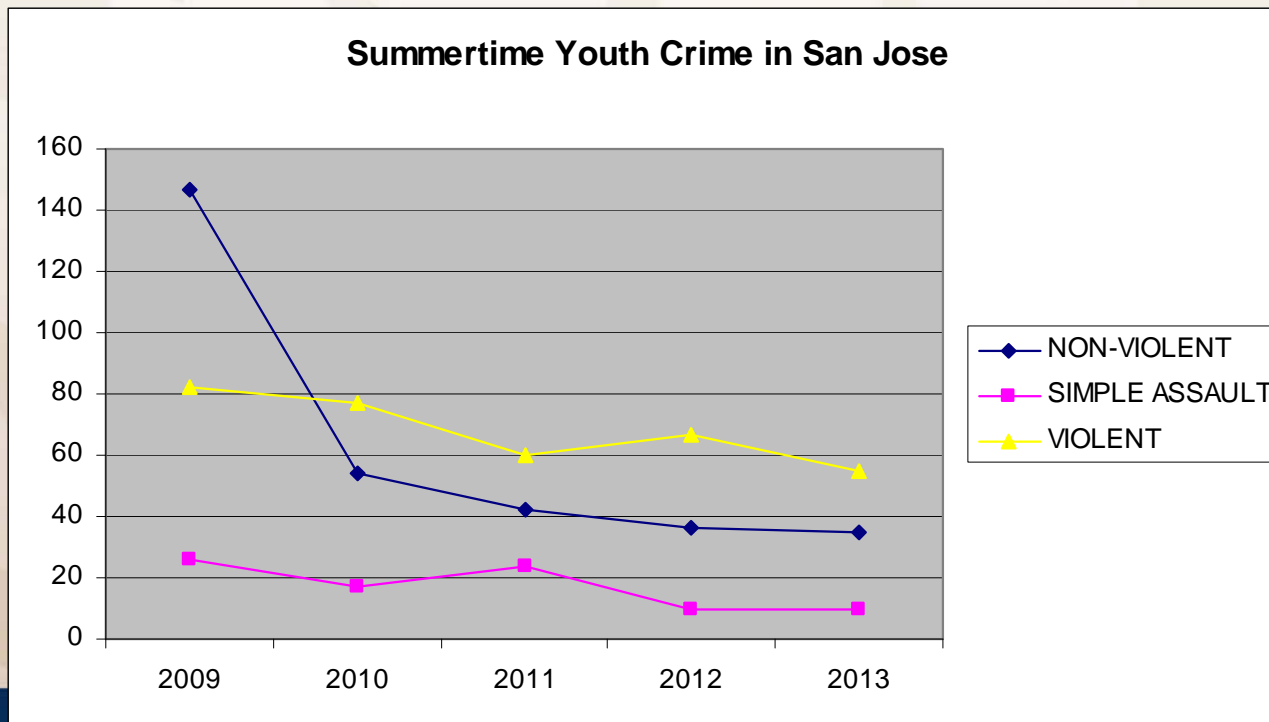

Participant Impacts

- 91% of participants were satisfied with their SSIG experience
- 94% of participants felt safe in SSIG programs and services
- 83% of participants learned more about services which may benefit them
- 6.0 caring adults; average per participant

Looking Forward

SSIG Summer 2014

- Increase award size: From \$8,000 to \$10,000
- Emphasizing higher dosage: Minimum 4 weeks of programming; 120 hrs of direct service.
- Align service period with school district calendars: Shift contract period back 2 weeks from June 15 – September 15 to June 1 to August 31
- Encourage greater connection to after school programs
