Goals

- Intentional outreach to victims of gang violence
- Connecting youth and families to services with the aim of reducing violence, fostering hope and preventing retaliation

SCVMC Data

2010 to 2012

- 333 admitted patients presented with injuries related to interpersonal violence 49% related to gunshot, stabbings or other piercing instruments

Criteria of Program

- Admitted trauma patient
- Victim of violence
- Age 13-30
- Resident of Santa Clara County

PROCESS

INITIAL PHASE 48 Hour Window

- Identify victims of violence
- Electronic health record surveillance
- Provider referral
- Medical Social Worker (MSW) surveillance

Process continued...

SERVICE PHASE

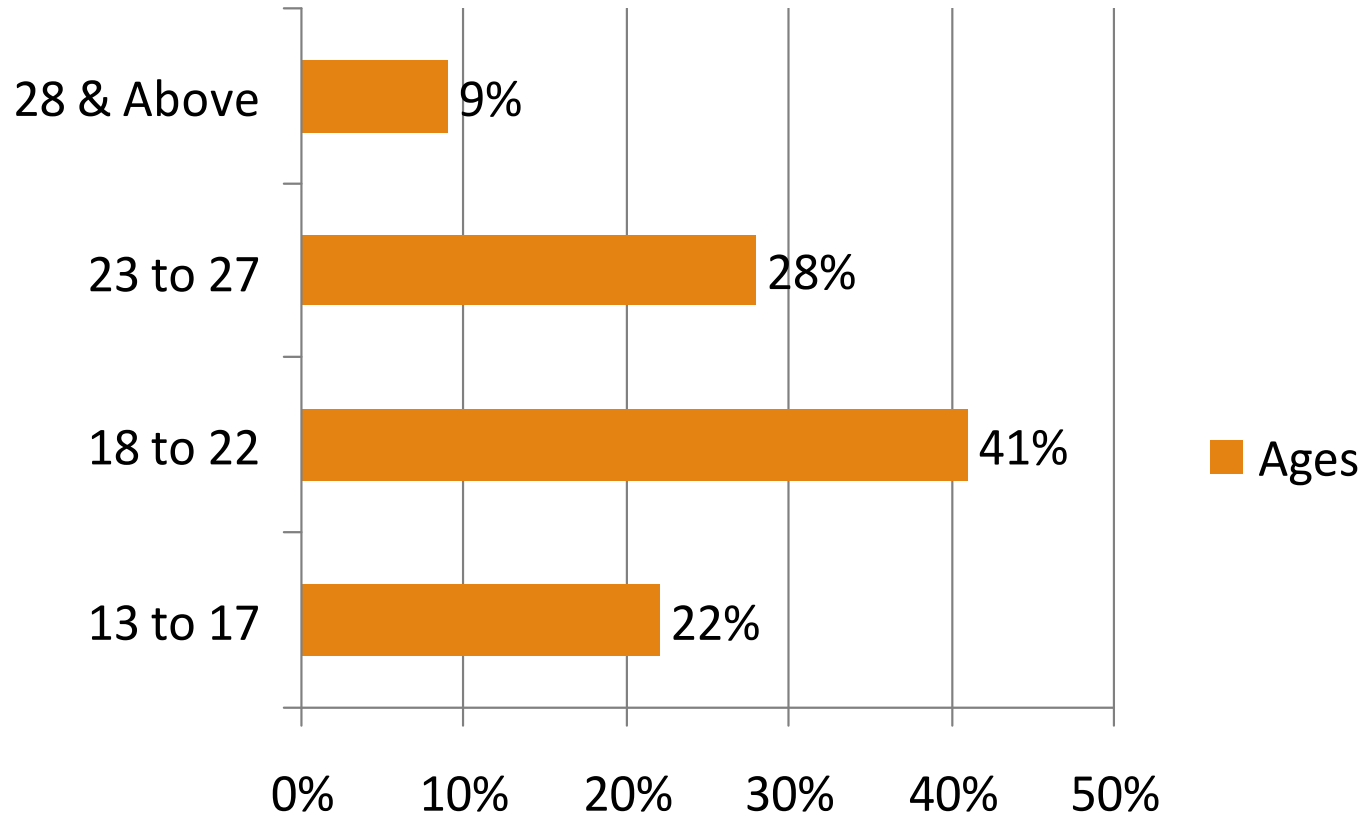
- Referral to City partners – Peer Interventionists and Faith Based Volunteers
- Patient visit and assessment
- Service referrals and ongoing follow-up by City partners

Trauma to Triumph September 11, 2012 to September 30, 2013

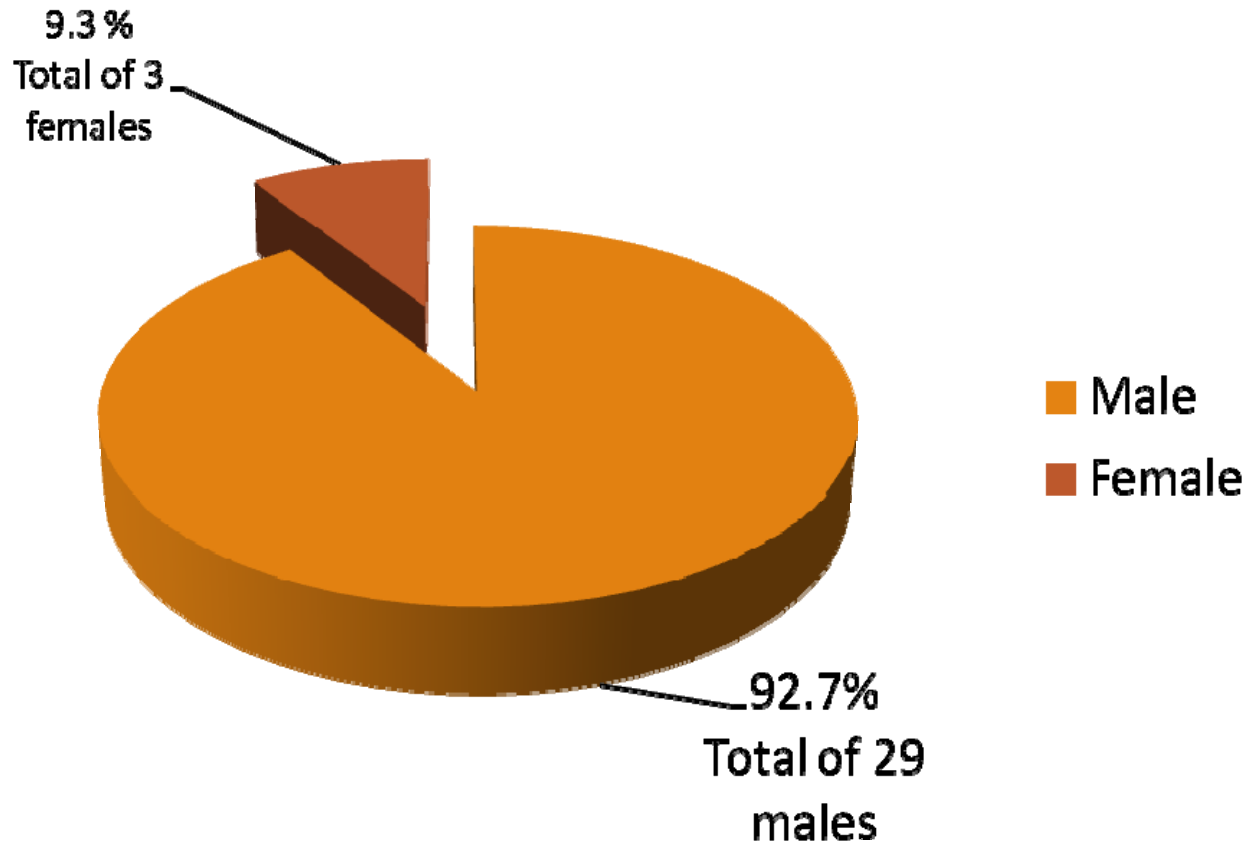

Age Range of Consented Patients

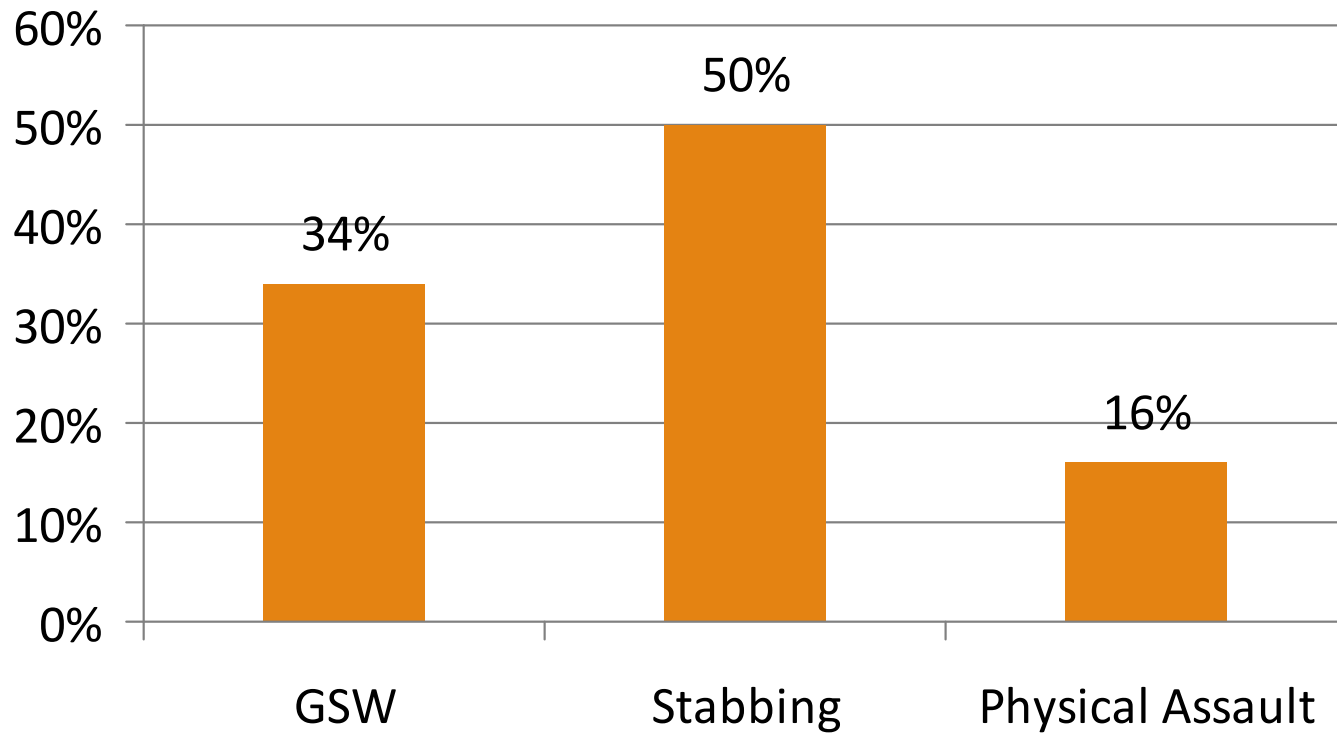
