

Past to Future

- Strong MGPTF/VMC Partnership since 1995 through Clean Slate Tattoo Removal
 - End of Transformation

Proposed

- VMC Bedside Pilot:
 - Maximize the 48 hour window
 - Partnership to start transformation

VMC Pilot

Goals:

- 1. Intentional outreach to victims of Gang Violence.
- 2. Referral to services for youth and families aimed at violence reduction and fostering hope.
- 3. Strategic and effective use of limited resources.
- A safer environment focused on Health Care and holistic recovery.

Products:

- A hospital based intervention protocol to respond to victims of Gang Violence.
- Selection and distribution of Prevention and Intervention curriculum based services and materials.
- 3. Agreements (M.O.U.) between VMC, MGPTF, and selected BEST funded agencies that formalize the partnership and facilitate the provision of needed services.

VMC Pilot

Measurements

- Number of Calls for Services from VMC
- Number of Interventions Face Time with Victim
- Number of Victims Successfully Connected to Services Within 3 Months
 - *Benchmark for success: 30% of referred patients received services

Target Population Criteria

- 13 to 30 years of age
- Live within Santa Clara County
- Involved in a gang related injury

Pilot Procedure

- Referrals and Screening/Assessment
- Culturally Competent Intervention
 - Coordinated 20 min engagement
 - Includes Chaplaincy Faith Component
- Post Intervention
 - Referral and Service Linkages
 - Home Visits
