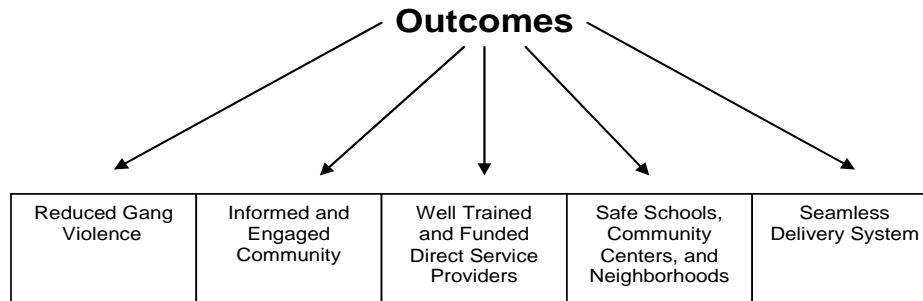
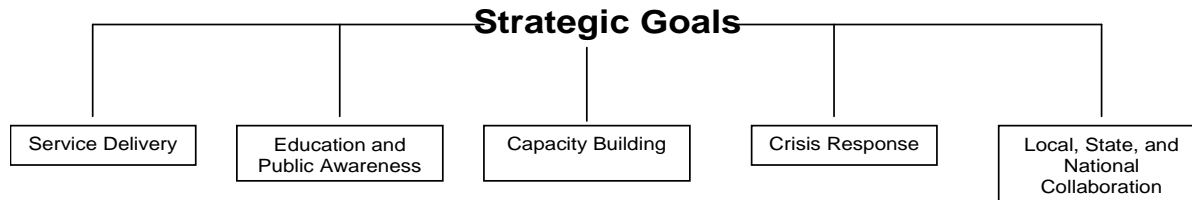


Vision


