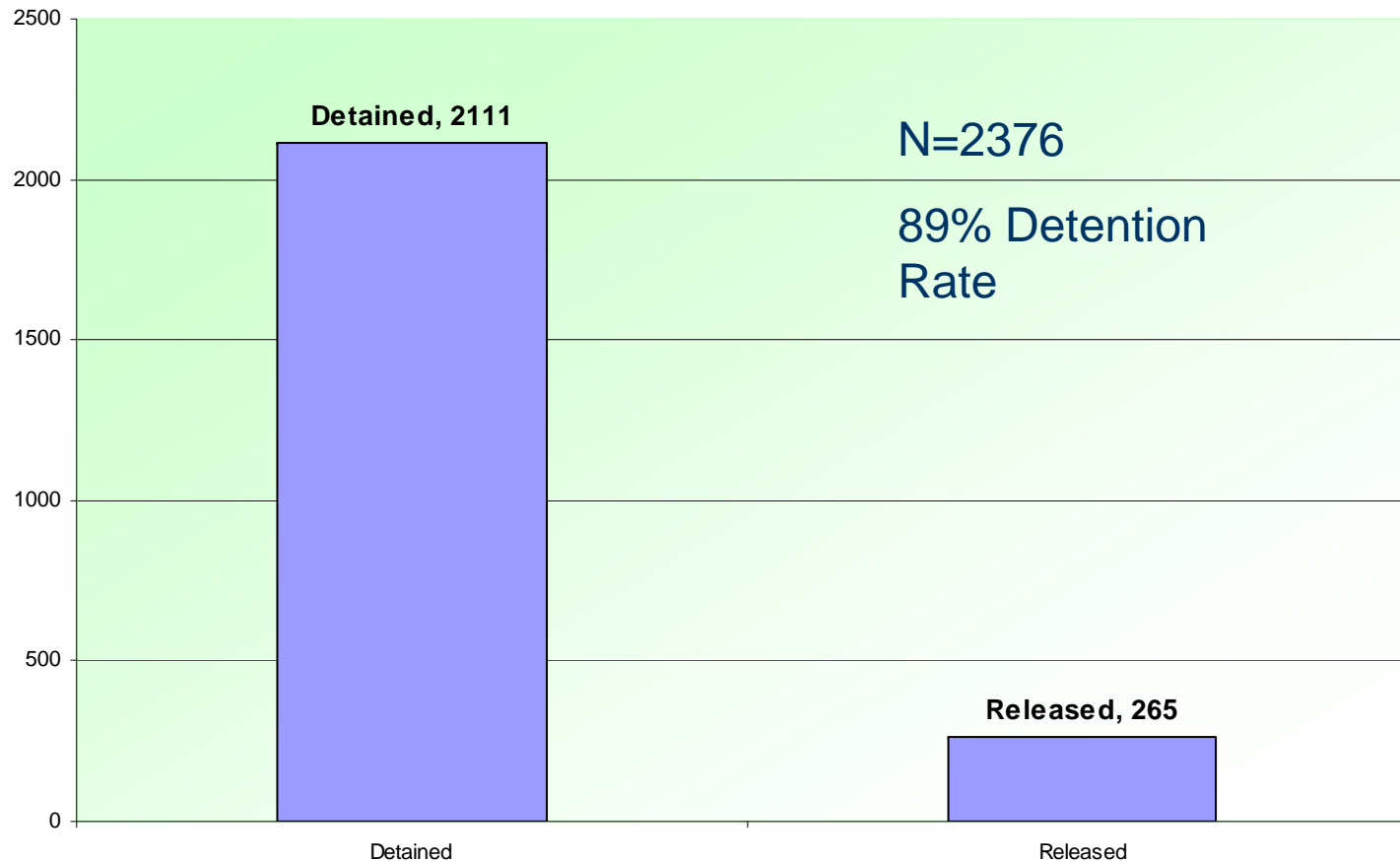

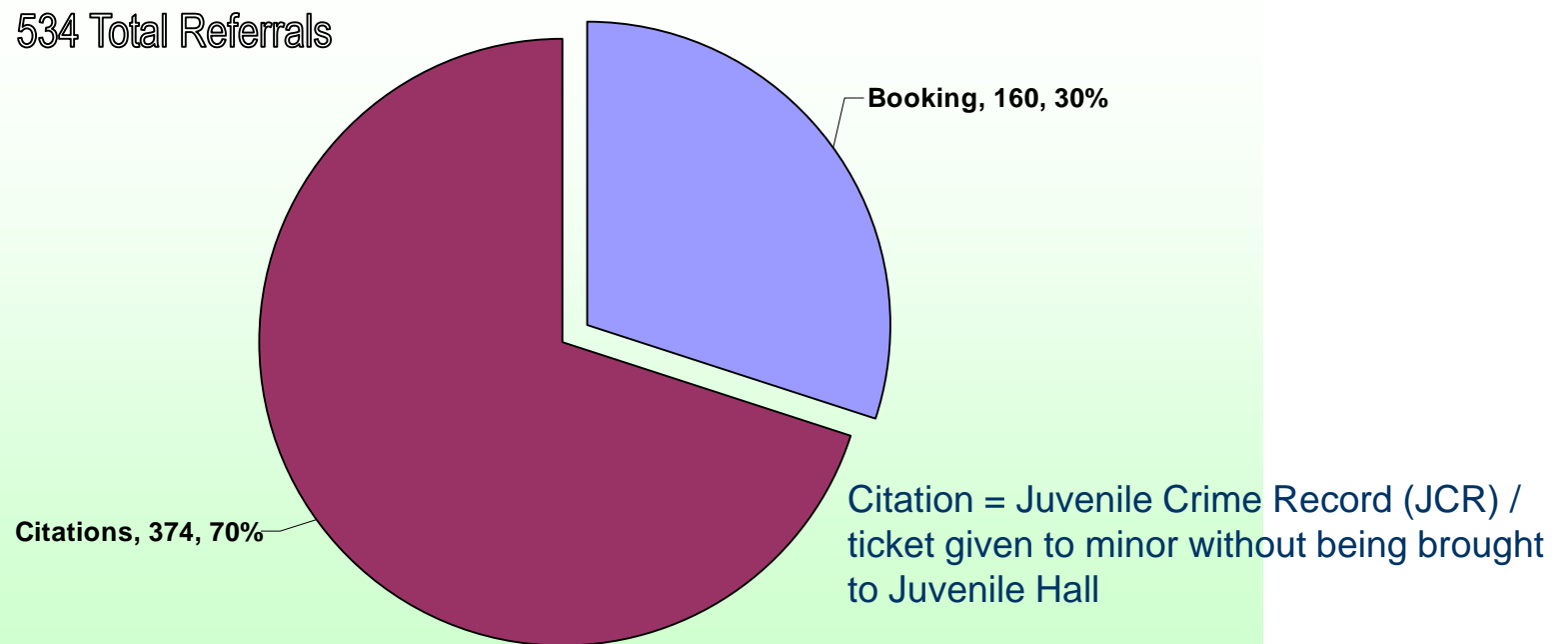

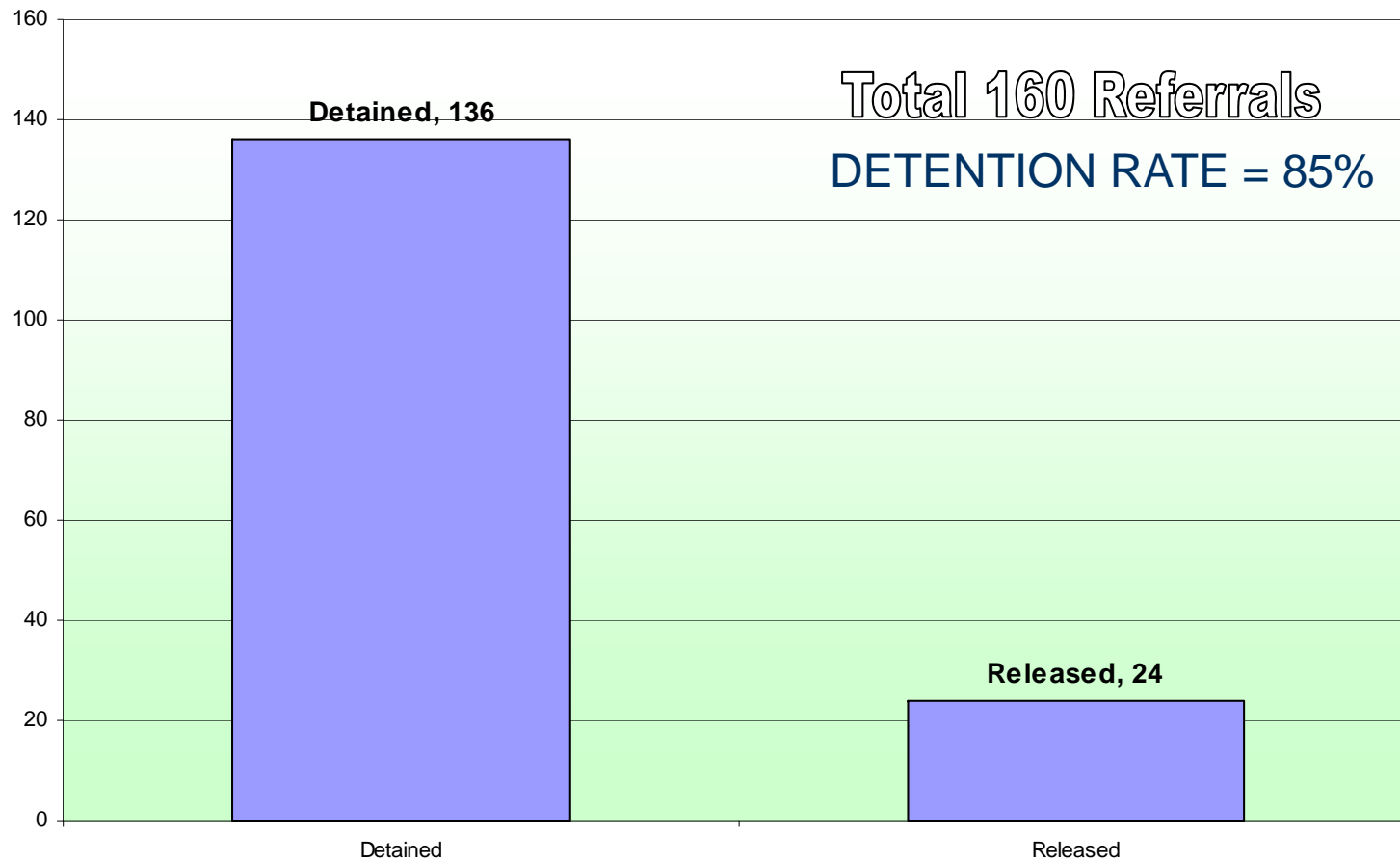
# JUVENILE HALL BOOKINGS FY 2007 (Countywide)



# FY07 Auto Thefts (VC 10851) Referrals to Probation (Countywide)



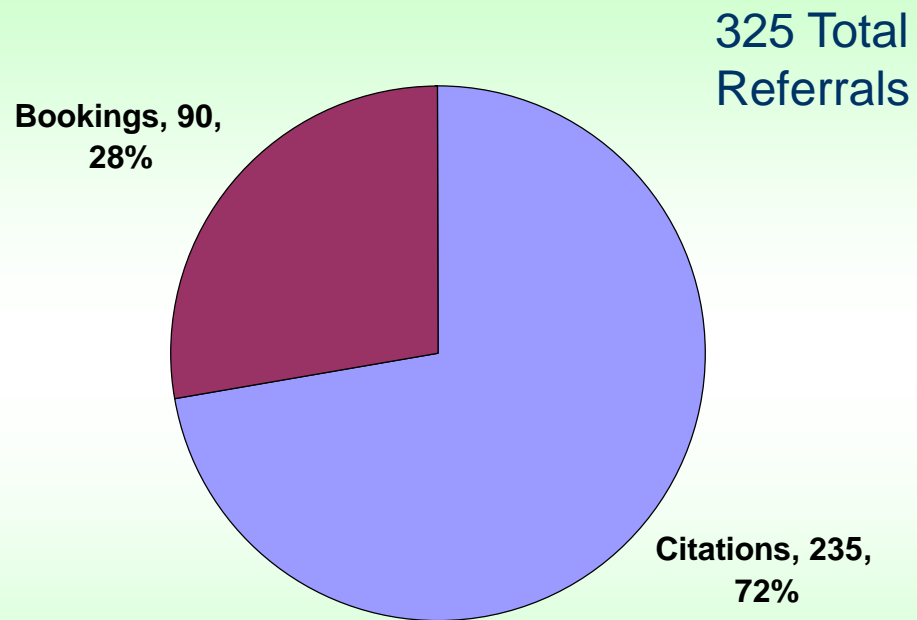
# Auto Theft (VC 10851) Referrals to Juvenile Hall (Countywide)



## 24 Minors Auto Theft (VC 10851) Referrals Released by Juvenile Hall Screening

- 6 Minors Conditionally Released to Community Release Program/Electronic Monitoring Program (CRP/EMP)
- 3 Minors Transferred to Another County
- 1 Minor Continued Counseling – was recently removed and continued the case as 300 (Dependency) case
- 14 Minors Straight Released (Minors released without conditions, e.g., CRP/EMP)

# Recent Policy Implementations

- In response to auto theft crisis in the community, minors brought to Juvenile Hall for auto thefts (VC 10851) will not be straight released until further notice
- Minors will instead be released to CRP/EMP placing them on house arrest until DA review (within 48 hours) or their court date.



# MGPTF/JDR Recent Agreements

- Collaboration with City/Santa Clara County Probation Department on anti-graffiti program.
- Results-based allocation of resources on different levels of the process (Prevention, Suppression and Intervention)
  - Contracts Management staff (City and County) to conduct an inventory of current services and to determine overlap of services to ensure we are delivering evidenced-based services to youth in the most efficient manner.
- Referrals to the intervention agencies at time of citation and release or part of the sentencing.
